As the population ages, home and community care are becoming especially important as people want health care as close to home as possible. Hospice Niagara's services include providing palliative care in client's homes, working in partnership with family physicians, and visiting nurses and their primary care providers.

With the focus to improve access to quality hospice palliative care, Hospice Niagara is partnering with family health teams and physicians to transform primary care. Last year, more than 21 interdisciplinary professionals were trained by Hospice Niagara specialists in palliative and end-of-life care. This sets the stage for patients to receive timely palliative care from their primary family physician with support from our palliative care secondary specialists.

For Dr. Brian Kerley, being a champion of hospice palliative care has become a lifelong endeavour. He firmly believes that this much-needed care embodies the essence of what medicine should be: providing comfort and support to patients and their families during the last leg of their life's journey and maximizing their quality of life.

Through providing care over the past 30 years to patients at the end phase of their lives, this philosophy of care is inherent, so much so that he was recently recognized by his peers with a Niagara Region Distinguished Physician Service Award based on the work he performs in his own family practice and as the Medical Director at the Stabler Centre—a 10-bed hospice residence in St. Catharines. "My passion for providing timely and effective care to my patients has always been at the forefront of my work and will continue to be moving forward," says Dr. Kerley.

At Hospice Niagara, that quality of care is delivered to each and every client, whether served at the hospice or in their homes by our trained teams and volunteers. By putting clients and families at the centre of everything, the organization will continue to strive for excellence so that clients, families and the community are confident that their care is responsive to their individual needs and is efficiently delivered.
